# **Canoe Action & Adventure Kamp**

The Canoe Action & Adventure Kamp is two camps in one - a Canoe Action Camp (CAC) for Expedition Rangers and a Canoe Adventure Kamp (CAK) for Adventure Rangers and adult leaders. Both camps take place at the same time and follow much of the same format and schedule although action camp (CAC) trainees must participate in selected classes and activities that the adventure Kamp (CAK) campers do not. Refer to the camper applications for registration fees and participation requirements for each camp. Both camps provide opportunities to learn and participate in a canoeing adventure over a 3-day period in some of the most scenic areas of the county, the Ozark National Scenic Riverways in southeast Missouri.

### **KEY FEATURES**

- Everyone is responsible for bringing their own boats & floating gear unless prior arrangements have been made. We typically have a limited number of extra boats available but you will need to let us know in advance if you need to reserve one.
- Everyone is responsible for bringing and preparing their own meals. We will all be camping floating together as a group so you can plan meals as an outpost or with others if you choose.
- Boys must be in high school to participate in the Action Camp or in middle school to participate
  in the Adventure Kamp. Younger boys may participate in the Adventure Kamp if accompanied
  by a parent or legal guardian.
- Action Camp trainees must arrive at the camp location by 2PM on Thursday and participate in all
  the floating skills classes and other activities. Adventure Kamp participants can arrive at any
  time but must be ready to begin the float at the launch point by 9:30 AM on Friday.

## **MEALS**

## **TRANSPORTATION & ARRIVAL**

All ACTION camp participants must be at the camp location by 2PM on Thursday. All ADVENTURE kamp participants must be at the camp by 9:30AM on Friday but they are welcome to come earlier. You are responsible for your own transportation to and from the camp location but if you would like to ride with a group, we will be leaving from Ozark AG at 10AM on Thursday.
